PAKISTANI UPDATE - Easter Sunday was a great day! We had a large crowd at Bangjak Baptist Church in Bangkok, Thailand. Pastor Ricky Salmon preached a wonderful message to the Pakistani refugees. These are the folks that we are ministering to. At the same time, we had 12 more families join on Zoom. These were families that live too far away or felt it was too dangerous for them travel to the Everyone had tea and cookies (they call them church. crackers) after the service, along with a good time of fellowship. Thank you all for praying for our Easter services this year. It was a wonderful success!

Many have the perception that when a missionary is on furlough, he is able to spend quality time with his family

and rest up. That may be true for some, but my wife and I are way busier here in the States than when we are on the field. Whether I am in Bangkok or here in the States, I still preach on Zoom to the Pakistanis on Sundays and Wednesdays. Then, I preach a youth meeting on Thursdays and teach a men's Bible study on Fridays. My wife teaches a ladies Bible study on Saturdays. And while we are here in the States, I am also typically preaching somewhere every Sunday morning and Sunday night, and Wednesday night if possible. And then there are the Missions Conferences. So, on average, I am preaching seven to ten times a week. And in between, there is a lot of driving. I am not complaining. preaching and telling people about what we do. I just think it is good for you to know that we are not sitting around and doing nothing. Hahaha!

Over the month of April, we will be traveling from Texas to the East Coast. I have appointments for almost every single service available. We are busy and God is blessing!
